Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility



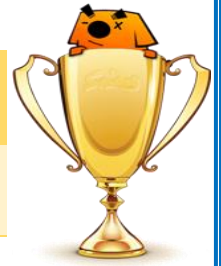

This club is for YEAR 6 students only!

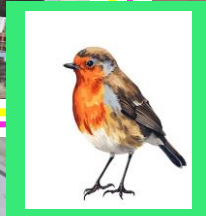

Topic work – Spring term 2

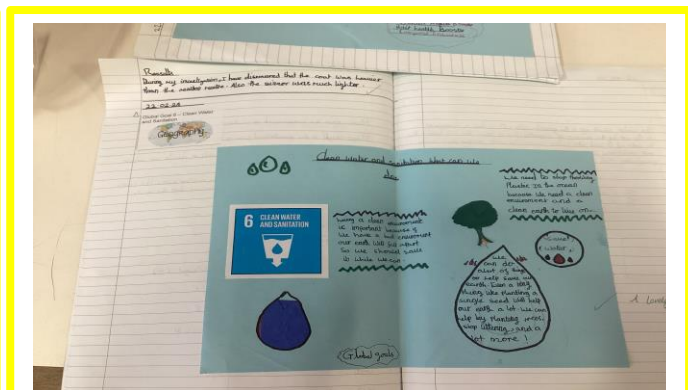
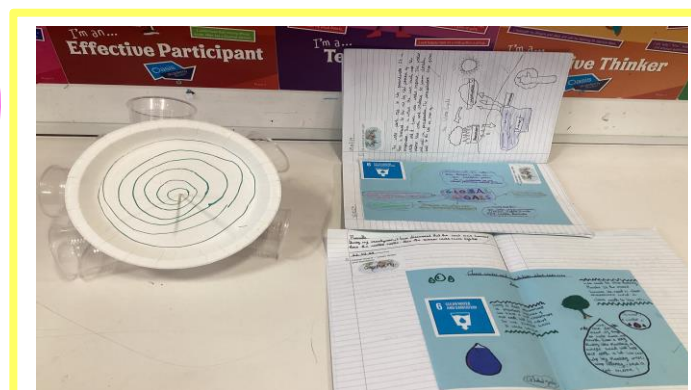
Year 2 – Roots to Fruit outdoor learning:
