## The role of a Prevent Officer



- **Knowledge of the prevent duty**, this is done through staff training and weekly staff briefings.
- Knowledge and understanding of DfE and Home Office policy relating to Safe Guarding & Young People against extremism and radicalisation, all guidance is given out to staff and online training is completed by all.
- To respond to all forms of extremism, leading to terrorism, this is done by following all processes and procedures and being aware of the CASS referral system
- To include all Islamic and far right threats, it is important to making staff and children aware of all types of threats.
- Safeguard and educate young people, parents and communities, this is done through running **Workshops for parents and the wider community**, through adding all areas into our curriculum, updating parents through newsletters and keeping the website updated.
- Identify vulnerabilities and risk, this is done through **training all staff** to look out for signs and knowing the reporting system
- **Deliver training to all staff**, this takes place yearly to all staff including LTS and Academy Councillors.
- Be aware of the **Prevent training Toolkit**, this is to make sure that all staff are aware on how to make referrals.
- **Solution** Keep updated with police, home office and department of education guidance
- All staff to be aware of current E-Safety best practice, and children to know about E-safety and how to report concerns
- Planning prevent into school curriculum Prescriptive and resources for staff.
