<p>Brahman in Hinduism is the supreme and infinite spirit that is everywhere and in everything. It is like the ultimate power or energy that creates and connects all life.</p>	<p>Brahma is the god of creation in Hinduism, who made the universe and everything in it. He is often shown with four heads, looking in all directions to symbolize his knowledge.</p>	<p>Vishnu is the god who protects the universe and keeps everything in balance. He is known for coming to Earth in different forms, called avatars, to help when there is trouble.</p>	<p>Shiva is the god of destruction and transformation in Hinduism, helping to remove the old so that new things can grow. He is often seen meditating or dancing, showing his power over creation and change.</p>
