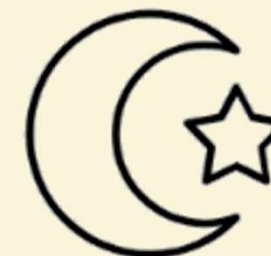

Prophets are special people chosen by God to teach others how to live good and kind lives. They share messages from God and help guide people to follow the right path.	The Arabic word for the one and only God is 'Allah'. Muslims consider it disrespectful to draw or paint a picture of Allah or Muhammad (pbuh).	Muslims beliefs have been set down in the Qur'an. They believe the Qur'an contains words of God as revealed to Muhammad (pbuh).	The Abrahamic religions—Judaism, Christianity, and Islam—are called this because they all honour Abraham as an important figure. These religions share many stories and beliefs about God, teaching people to be kind and do good things.

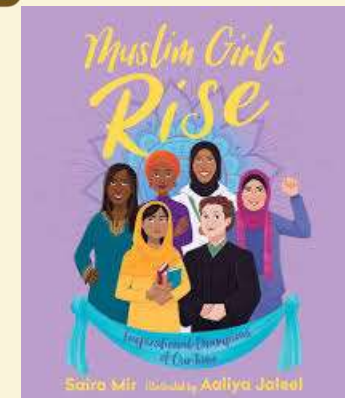
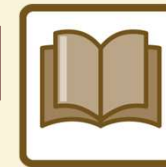
- Know that Judaism has many similarities to Christianity.
