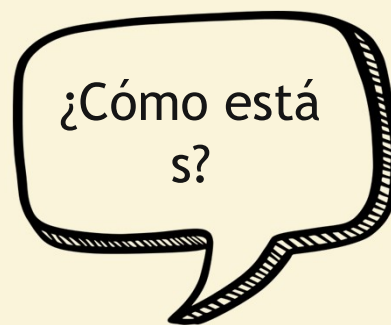

¿Dónde se habla Español?

More than 500 million people in the world speak Spanish -

Spanish is spoken in 20 countries

Mexico is the country with the most Spanish speakers - 110 million people

Spanish people often greet each other with a kiss on both cheeks

Spanish questions have a question mark at the end - but they also have an inverted (upside down) question mark at the beginning - ¿Cómo estás?
