## Key Dates:

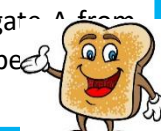
- 9<sup>th</sup> March 2023 - World book day.

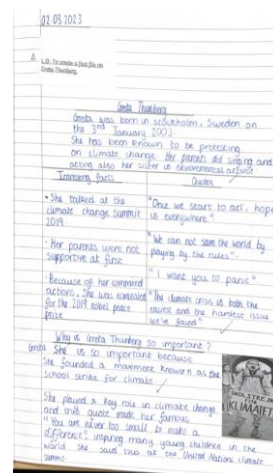


## Year 2:

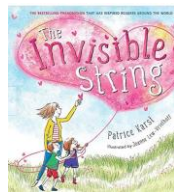
