It has been a busy few weeks at Oasis Academy Boulton. Last week on Tuesday 26th September we celebrated European Day of Languages. This is a celebration of the range and diversity of languages spoken throughout Europe by celebrating the languages spoken in our school. Each class was assigned a European Language. Children immersed themselves in sensory experiences by cooking food eaten in these countries. For example, Early Years had a day discovering life in Switzerland and made Chocolate lollipops, Year 3 explored Greece and made Greek Salad. It was wonderful to see children coming into school dressed in the colours of the flag of the country assigned to them.

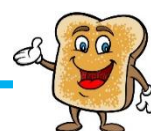

 Greek Salad	
 Step 1 - Make sure the surface is clean and clear	
 Step 2 - Wash hands	
 Step 3- Chop the olives into small pieces	
 Step 4- Chop the cucumber into 1/4s	
 Step 5- Chop the tomatoes into 1/4s	
 Step 6 - Chop the feta into cubes	
	 Step 7 - Mix the salad together
	 Step 8 - Drizzle some olive oil into the mix and stir
	 Step 9 - Squeeze the lemon wedge and mix
	 Step 10- Sprinkle the oregano into the salad and mix again
